RSMo 571.101
Person Protected Information

- Concealed Carry Permit information shall not be public information and shall be considered personal protected information;
- A sheriff may access the concealed carry permit system for administrative purposes;

RSMo 571.101

- Shall only be made available for a single-entry query of an individual in the event the individual is a subject of interest in an active criminal investigation or is arrested for a crime.
- Information retained in the concealed carry permit system shall not be distributed to any federal, state, or private entities; and

- Any person who violates the provisions of this subsection by disclosing protected information shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

Discussion – 571.101

Term “Sheriff”

- “shall include the sheriff of any county or city not within a county or his or her designee and in counties of the first classification the sheriff may designate the chief of police of any city, town, or municipality within such county.”

Discussion – 571.101

The Term “Concealed Carry Permit”

- “shall include any concealed carry endorsement issued by the department of revenue before January 1, 2014, and any concealed carry document issued by any sheriff or under the authority of any sheriff after December 31, 2013.”

Discussion – 571.101

Where to Apply

- An application for a concealed carry permit shall be made to the sheriff of the county or any city not within a county in which the applicant resides.

Discussion – 571.101

Eligibility

1. 19 YOA or older;
2. US Citizen/Permanent Resident;
3. MO Resident, or; *(Discuss property owned in MO)*
4. 18 YOA with Military Exemption;
5. Complies with 571.101 (3)(4)(5)(6)(7)(8);
6. Submits a completed application;
7. No valid full order of protection; and
8. Not prohibited from possessing a weapon.

Discussion – 571.101

Eligibility: 571.101 (3)(4)(5)(6)(7)(8);

(3) Has not pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere or been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of any state or of the United States other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer or gas gun;

Discussion – 571.101

Eligibility: 571.101 (3)(4)(5)(6)(7)(8);

(4) Has not been convicted of, pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere to one or more misdemeanor offenses involving crimes of violence within a five-year period immediately preceding application for a concealed carry permit or if the applicant has not been convicted of two or more misdemeanor offenses involving driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or the possession or abuse of a controlled substance within a five-year period immediately preceding application for a concealed carry permit;

Eligibility: 571.101 (3)(4)(5)(6)(7)(8);
(5) Is not a fugitive from justice or currently charged in an information or indictment with the commission of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of any state of the United States other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer, or gas gun;

Discussion – 571.101

Eligibility: 571.101 (3)(4)(5)(6)(7)(8);
(6) Has not been discharged under dishonorable conditions from the United States Armed Forces;

Discussion – 571.101

Eligibility: 571.101 (3)(4)(5)(6)(7)(8);
(7) Has not engaged in a pattern of behavior, documented in public or closed records, that causes the sheriff to have a reasonable belief that the applicant presents a danger to himself or others;

Discussion – 571.101

Eligibility: 571.101 (3)(4)(5)(6)(7)(8):
(8) Is not adjudged mentally incompetent at the time of application or for five years prior to application, or has not been committed to a mental health facility, as defined in section 632.005, or a similar institution located in another state following a hearing at which the defendant was represented by counsel or a representative;
Note: (96 hour holds DO NOT apply)

Discussion – 571.101

Application

- Shall be filed in writing;
- Signed under oath and under the penalties of perjury; and
- Shall contain only:
 - The applicant's name, address, telephone number, gender, date and place of birth, and, if the applicant is not a United States citizen, the applicant's country of citizenship and any alien or admission number issued by the Federal Bureau of Customs and Immigration Enforcement or any successor agency; and
 - (2)(3)(4)(5)(6)(7)(8)(9)(10)(11) and (12).

Discussion – 571.101

Application - Retention

- The sheriff shall keep a record of all applications for a concealed carry permit or a provisional permit and his or her action thereon;
- Any record of an application that is incomplete or denied for any reason shall be kept for a period **not to exceed one year**;

Discussion – 571.101

Application – Retention -- continued

- Any record of an application that was approved shall be kept for a period of one year after the expiration and nonrenewal of the permit. *(Retain Instructor Records)*
- Sheriff Records Retention Schedule
 - **3 Years from issue or Renewal; Denied applications, 1 year**

Discussion – 571.101

Fees

- Non-refundable;
- Sheriff shall charge for a new application;
- New Application: Not to exceed \$100.00 plus applicable credit/debit card fees;
- Renewal: Not to exceed \$50.00 plus applicable credit/debit card fees; and
- Deposited into Sheriff’s revolving fund. May be transferred to discretionary funds for county sheriffs. *(As of October 14, 2016)*

Discussion – 571.101

Background Check

- The sheriff shall make only such inquiries as he or she deems necessary into the accuracy of the statements made in the application;
- The sheriff may require that the applicant display a Missouri driver's license or nondriver's license or military identification and orders; *(571.101 & Sheriff may not choose)*

Discussion – 571.101

Background Check -- continued

- Must begin **within 3 working days** after submission of proper application;
- The applicant shall be fingerprinted;
- (No other Biometric Data to be collected)
- Conduct a NICS Check;
- Submit Fingerprints to FBI if NICS is clean. *"If no disqualifying record is identified by these checks at the state level, the fingerprints shall be forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record check."*

Discussion – 571.101

Denying an Application

- If eligibility requirements are not met; or
- There is a demonstrable reason to believe that the applicant has rendered a false statement;
- Sheriff is required to deny the application; and

Discussion – 571.101

Denying an Application

- Must notify the applicant in writing;
- Stating the grounds for denial;
- Notice of 30 days maximum to appeal and submit additional documents related to the ground for appeal;

Discussion – 571.101

Appeal Procedure

- Sheriff must reconsider and inform the applicant of the results within 30 days of receiving the additional documentation;
- The applicant shall further be informed in writing of the right to appeal the denial pursuant to subsections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of section 571.114.
- After two additional reviews and denials by the sheriff, the applicant shall appeal to the court.

Discussion – 571.101

Provisional Permit

- If no disqualifiers are found and the background check is not back within 45 calendar days the sheriff shall issue a provisional permit; (when do you start counting?)
 - Even though the background check must begin within 3 working days after submission of the proper application.
 - It may be best practice to begin the 45 day count when the proper application is submitted.

Discussion – 571.101

Provisional Permit -- continued

- It must be clearly designated as “Provisional”
- Signed in front of Sheriff or designee;
- Is good until the sheriff issues or denies a “Permit”;
- Must revoke within 24 hours of receiving disqualifying information;
- Must follow same procedures as a denial.

Discussion – 571.101

Permit

The concealed carry permit shall specify only the following information:

- Name
- Address
- Date of Birth
- Gender
- Height
- Weight
- Hair Color
- Eye Color
- Permit holder Signature
- Sheriff's Signature
- Issue Date
- Expiration Date
- Assigned a CCP system county code stored in sequential number.

Discussion – 571.101

Expiration

- Permit: 5 years from the last day of the month of issue or renewal;

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Suspension/Revocation

- Shall be suspended or revoked if the endorsement holder becomes ineligible for such reasons under the criteria established in subdivisions (3), (4), (5), (8), and (11) of subsection 2 of section 571.101 or upon the issuance of a valid full order of protection.
- #2 & #7 have been removed. #8 & #11 Added.

Discussion – 571.101

571.101 (3)(4)(5)(6)(7)(8);

(3) Has not pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere or been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year under the laws of any state or of the United States other than a crime classified as a misdemeanor under the laws of any state and punishable by a term of imprisonment of two years or less that does not involve an explosive weapon, firearm, firearm silencer or gas gun;

Discussion – 571.101

Discussion – 571.101

Discussion – 571.101

571.101 (3)(4)(5)(6)(~~7~~)(8);
~~(7) Has not engaged in a pattern of behavior, documented in public or closed records, that causes the sheriff to have a reasonable belief that the applicant presents a danger to himself or others; HAS BEEN REMOVED.~~

Discussion – 571.101

Eligibility: 571.101 (3)(4)(5)(6)(7)(8);
(8) Is not adjudged mentally incompetent at the time of application or for five years prior to application, or has not been committed to a mental health facility, as defined in section 632.005, or a similar institution located in another state following a hearing at which the defendant was represented by counsel or a representative;

Discussion – 571.101

Eligibility: 571.101 (3)(4)(5)(6)(7)(8)(11);
(11) Is not the respondent of a valid full order of protection which is still in effect.

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Surrender/Collecting

- When a valid full order of protection, or any arrest warrant, discharge, or commitment for the reasons listed in subdivision (3), (4), (5), (8), or (11) of subsection 2 of section 571.101, is issued.
- #2 & #7 have been removed. #8 & #11 Added.

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Surrender/Collecting Permit -- continued

Permit:

- Shall be suspended or revoked if the holder becomes ineligible under the criteria established in subdivisions (3), (4), (5), (8), and (11) of subsection 2 of section 571.101 or upon the issuance of a valid full order of protection.

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Surrender/Collecting Permit -- continued

Permit:

- Holder shall surrender the permit;
- The official to whom the permit is surrendered shall administratively suspend the permit in the concealed carry permit system;

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Surrender/Collecting Permit -- continued

Permit:

- Upon dismissal, the court holding the permit shall return such permit to the individual; and
- The official to whom the permit was surrendered shall administratively return the permit to good standing within the concealed carry permit system.

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Surrender/Collecting Permit -- continued
Permit:

- Any conviction, discharge, or commitment specified in sections 571.101 to 571.121 shall result in a revocation.
- Upon conviction, the court shall forward a notice of conviction or action and the permit to the issuing county sheriff.
- The sheriff who issued the concealed carry permit shall report the change in status of the MSCCP System.

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Renewal:

- Shall be renewed on receipt of the properly completed renewal application and fee;
- Same application as new applicant uses;
- Cannot fingerprint on renewal;
- No training certificate required;
- Need only display current permit;
- NICS check only. (No timeframe specified)

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Renewal By Mail:

- Beginning August 28, 2020, an active military member may complete the renewal of his or her endorsement or permit under subdivision (2) of this subsection* by mail.
- an active military member shall mail to the sheriff who issued his or her permit a renewal application...

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Renewal By Mail: -- continued

- a copy of his or her current concealed carry permit, a military identification acceptable for in-person renewal of permits, and the renewal fee.
- The active military member may pick up the renewed permit in person or may request the permit be mailed to a provided address by certified mail.

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Renewal By Mail: -- continued

- The sheriff may require the active military member to pay the postage and insurance costs associated with mailing the permit, but the costs shall **not exceed ten dollars**.

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Late Fees:

- **Shall** be \$10.00 per month up to 6 months;
- After 6 months sheriff shall cancel permit;
- No requirement to notify holder.

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Late Fees: Active Military Member Exception

- No Fee if it expires while the person is an Active Military Member..... AND renewed within **two months** of returning to Missouri after discharge from such duty or recovery from such incapacitation.
- Penalties shall begin to accrue upon the expiration of the two-month period

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Change of Residency:

- Shall notify the sheriff of the new jurisdiction;
- Within 30 days;
- Of a location outside the county of permit issuance;
- New sheriff shall notify the sheriff in the old jurisdiction (No timeframe specified);

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Change of Residency: -- continued

- The sheriff in the old jurisdiction shall transfer any information on file for the permit holder to the sheriff in the new jurisdiction;
- Within 30 days.
- May charge a processing fee of not more than \$10.00.

Note: Whether files are transferred has nothing to do issuing the new permit.

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Change of Residency: -- continued

- The sheriff shall report the residence change to the MSCCP system, take possession and destroy the old permit, and then issue a new permit to the permit holder (No timeframe);
- The new address shall be accessible by the MSCCP System within 3 days of receipt of the information (NOT WORKING DAYS)

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Loss or Destruction:

- Shall notify the sheriff of the holder's county or city of residence within 7 days after actual knowledge of the loss or destruction;
- May charge a processing fee of \$10.00 for costs of replacing a lost or destroyed permit

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Loss or Destruction: -- continued

- Shall reissue a new concealed carry permit within 3 working days of being notified of the loss or destruction;
- The new permit shall contain the same personal information, including expiration date, as the original permit.

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Name Change:

- Shall furnish proof of the name change to the sheriff within 30 days of changing his or her name;
- Display his or her concealed carry permit;
- Sheriff may charge a processing fee of not more than \$10.00;
- New name shall be accessible by the MSCCP System within 3 days of receipt of the information;

Discussion RSMo 571.104

Name Change: -- continued

- Shall be automatically invalid after 180 days if the permit or endorsement holder has changed their name or changed his or her residence (to another county) and not notified the sheriff;
- The sheriff shall assess a late penalty of \$10.00 per month for each month, up to six months not to exceed \$60 dollars, for the failure to notify the sheriff of the change of name or address (to another county) within 30 days.

Discussion RSMo 571.111

Training:

- An applicant shall demonstrate knowledge of firearms safety training;
- This requirement shall be fully satisfied if they meet requirements 571.111.1 (1) (2) (3) (4) (5) (6) (7)
- No expiration on training; and
- 1 Hour online/classroom from only a NRA instructor. Still requires any instructor to perform a live fire exercise/range training portion.

Discussion RSMo 571.111

Training:
Course Content

- 571.111.2 (1) (2) (3) (4) (5) (6) (7) (8) (9) (10);
- A minimum of 20 rounds practice;
- A minimum of 20 rounds live fire test;
- Either a Revolver OR Semiautomatic;
- No more than 40 students per certified instructor in the classroom;
- No more than 5 students per range officer.

Note: Range Officers do NOT have to be an instructor.

Discussion RSMo 571.111

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor:

- Shall be considered to be qualified by any sheriff issuing permits if:
 - 571.111.6 (1) (2) (3) (4) (5);

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor

571.111.6 (1) (2) (3) (4) (5);

(1) Is a valid firearms safety instructor certified by the National Rifle Association holding a rating as a personal protection instructor or pistol marksmanship instructor; or

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor

571.111.6 (1) (2) (3) (4) (5);

(2) Submits a photocopy of a notarized certificate from a firearms safety instructor's course offered by a local, state, or federal governmental agency; or

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor

571.111.6 (1) (2) (3) (4) (5);

(3) Submits a photocopy of a notarized certificate from a firearms safety instructor course approved by the department of public safety; or

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor

Courses approved by the Department of Public Safety:

- The 40+ hour Firearm Safety Instructor course submitted to DPS by LEOSA Trainers, Inc. out of Minnesota;
- The 21st Century Peacekeepers 50 hour LE Firearms Instructor School;

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor

Courses approved by the Department of Public Safety: --continued

- The Firearms Safety Instructor Course developed by the American Association of Certified Firearms Instructors; and
- The Firearms Safety Instructor Course developed by the U.S. Concealed Carry Association.

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor

571.111.6 (1) (2) (3) (4) (5);

(4) Has successfully completed a firearms safety instructor course given by or under the supervision of any state, county, municipal, or federal law enforcement agency; or

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor

571.111.6 (1) (2) (3) (4) (5);

(5) Is a certified police officer firearms safety instructor. *(Not defined in the law.)*

Discussion RSMo 571.111

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor:

- Instructor Database
 - Totally Voluntarily;
 - Instructor Certificate;
 - Notarized Course Outline;
 - A Recent Photograph;
 - In the county where the instructor resides.

Instructors to Maintain Records (571.111.5)

(1) Make the applicant's course records available upon request to the sheriff of the county in which the applicant resides; and

(2) Maintain all course records on students for a period of no less than four years from course completion date.

Note: This is why you get name, address & phone numbers for instructors.

Discussion RSMo 571.111

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor:

- The sheriff shall:
 - Review Instructor Certificate;
 - Review course outline;
 - Verify instructor is qualified;
 - Verify course meets requirements;
 - Shall collect an annual registration fee of \$10.00;
 - Good only for the calendar year.

Discussion RSMo 571.111

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor:

- The sheriff shall:
 - Submit instructor info to MSCCP System;
 - Registration only effective for the calendar year;
 - Sheriff may access database to verify instructors;

Discussion RSMo 571.111

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor:

- Instructor Credentials:
 - There is a difference between the expiration date that an instructor’s “Registration” in the statewide database; and
 - The expiration date of their “Instructor Credentials.”
 - These two dates MUST be looked at prior to accepting training conducted by an instructor.

Discussion RSMo 571.111

Qualified Firearms Safety Instructor:

- Unless a sheriff has reason to believe otherwise, a sheriff shall presume a firearms safety instructor is qualified if the instructor is registered in the statewide database.

RSMo 571.114

Denial of Application Court Appeal Procedure:

- A denied applicant shall have the right to appeal the denial within thirty days of receiving written notice of the denial. Such appeals shall be heard in small claims court.

RSMo 571.117

Revocation Court Procedure: RSMo 571.117

- Any person who has knowledge that another person, who was issued a concealed carry permit or endorsement never was or no longer is eligible for such under the criteria established in sections 571.101 to 571.121 may file a petition with the clerk of the small claims court to revoke that person's concealed carry permit or endorsement.
- Sheriff's Immunity

RSMo 571.117

Sheriff's Immunity:

- The office of the county sheriff or any employee or agent of the county sheriff shall not be liable for damages in any civil action arising from alleged wrongful or improper granting, renewing, or failure to revoke a concealed carry permit or endorsement, so long as the sheriff acted in good faith.

RSMo 21.750

Open Carry With a Permit

In any jurisdiction in which the open carrying of firearms is prohibited by ordinance, the open carrying of firearms shall not be prohibited in accordance with the following:

(a) Any person with a valid concealed carry endorsement or permit who is open carrying a firearm shall be required to have a valid concealed carry endorsement or permit from this state, or a permit from another state that is recognized by this state, in his or her possession at all times;

(b) Any person open carrying a firearm in such jurisdiction shall display his or her concealed carry endorsement or permit upon demand of a law enforcement officer;

(c) In the absence of any reasonable and articulable suspicion of criminal activity, no person carrying a concealed or unconcealed firearm shall be disarmed or physically restrained by a law enforcement officer unless under arrest; and

(d) Any person who violates this subdivision shall be subject to the penalty provided in section 571.121.

RSMo 571.121

Duty to Carry/Display Permit:

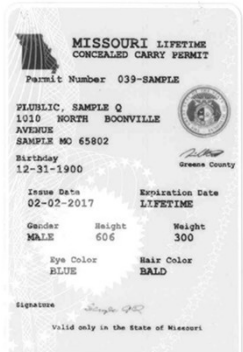
- Shall carry the concealed carry permit at all times the person is carrying a concealed firearm and shall display the concealed carry permit and a state or federal government-issued photo identification or the endorsement or permit upon the request of any peace officer.
- Failure to comply with this subsection shall not be a criminal offense but the concealed carry permit or endorsement holder may be issued a citation for an amount not to exceed thirty-five dollars.

LIFETIME OR EXTENDED CONCEALED CARRY PERMIT RSMO 571.205

- The statewide system is not capable of printing and tracking extended & lifetime permits;
- Legislators appropriated funds to update the system so it could;
- Governor Nixon withheld the funds;
- Despite Sheriffs asking, legislators have not appropriated funds since that time.

LIFETIME OR EXTENDED
CONCEALED CARRY
PERMIT RSMO 571.205

- Design must be approved by DPS.
- Lifetime is approved.
- Extended is not approved.



LIFETIME OR EXTENDED CONCEALED
CARRY PERMIT RSMO 571.205

- 10, 25 & Lifetime;
- Shall charge a nonrefundable fee not to exceed \$200/\$250/\$500;
- Valid in Missouri Only;
- Suspended if they move to another state;
- Reactivated if they move back;

LIFETIME OR EXTENDED
CONCEALED CARRY PERMIT

- Renewal/Suspension/Revocation 571.210
- Where they can/cannot carry 571.215
 - No criminal penalty
- Denial of Application 571.220
- Revocation Court Proceedings 571.225
- Duty to Carry/Display Permit 571.230

LIFETIME OR EXTENDED
CONCEALED CARRY PERMIT

Duty to Carry/Display Permit 571.230

- Any person issued a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit under sections 571.205 to 571.230, shall carry the permit at all times the person is carrying a concealed firearm and shall display the permit **and a state or federal government-issued photo identification** upon the request of any peace officer.
- Failure to comply with this section shall not be a criminal offense but the Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit holder may be issued a citation for an amount not to exceed thirty-five dollars.

LIFETIME OR EXTENDED
CONCEALED CARRY PERMIT

RSMo 571.210.8.

The sheriff of the county that issued the Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit shall conduct a name-based inquiry of the National Instant Criminal Background Check System once every five years from the date of issuance or renewal of the permit;

The sheriff shall review the results of the report from the National Instant Criminal Background Check System;

If the sheriff determines the permit holder is disqualified under any provision of section 571.205, the sheriff shall revoke the Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit and shall report the revocation to the concealed carry permit system.
